The art of stitching New altar frontal

striking new hanging adorns the altar of the Lady Chapel in St John's. It is a swirling abstract of Mother and Child in blues and reds that echo the chapel's stained glass windows, red railings and patterned blue-grey ceiling. Bugle beads glitter on two bright red flame-shapes, representing Pentecost.

'It is applique, not embroidery, due to the thickness and heaviness a frontal



requires,' explains Helen Davies, leader of Dorcas. This is the St John's group that designs and makes vestments, hangings, banners and altar frontals in both modern and classical styles for the church. To their delight, Helen's design — in colours painted by Liz Sergeant — received rapid approval from St Albans Cathedral, a process required for any new permanent item at St John's.

Six people worked on the frontal for some six years (interrupted by Covid lockdowns), meeting on Fridays in the chapel or St John's Church Hall. Both men and women take part in Dorcas and new members are very welcome. 'A varied knowledge of stitching is needed, as we don't teach, but we do help each other out,' says Helen. Prospective projects include adapting vestments for St John's new curate and the replacement of a chasuble made of sari silk now beyond repair, says Helen. She adds, 'We are a friendly group. Do come along if you are interested and prepared to laugh!'


Patronal Festival

On 25th June we celebrate our Patronal Festival. This is the Sunday nearest to the feast day of our patronal saint, John the Baptist, on 24th June. A patron saint is regarded as a heavenly advocate, or supporter, and every church in the Church of England has a patron saint. The nations of the United Kingdom have their patron saints too (St George, St Andrew, St David, St Patrick). St John the Baptist is known for being a prophet, the forerunner of Christ and the man who baptized Jesus in the River Jordan. He was chosen as our Patron because in



1907, 115 years ago, our church's foundation stone was laid on 24th June.

We will celebrate our patron saint with a special Eucharist service at 11.00am on Sunday 25^{th} June instead of the usual 9.30am Sunday service. A BBQ in the Vicarage Garden and rounders on the Common follow – do come!



St John the Baptist, our patron saint, features in a stained glass window in the north aisle of the church. He holds our church building. His rough garment represents camel hair, from the time he lived and preached in the desert. There's also a painted icon of St John the Baptist in the church on a nearby pillar. A smaller framed icon was presented to David Nye on his 40th anniversary as a Reader.

Who, how and why is a curate?

In July we welcome Ritah Namakula as our new curate at St John's. We look forward to a fuller introduction to her in our next edition of the magazine but for now it might be useful to explain some of the terminology! She is currently part of the congregation at Christ Church in Radlett. She will be ordained Deacon at St Albans Cathedral at 4pm on Saturday 1st July.

Why is she here? Ritah is coming to St John's and Southdown to continue her training to be a Vicar in the Church of England and will be with us for the next three years.

What is curacy? A curacy is three years' worth of 'on the job' training for those who are going into position of leadership in the church. She will learn how to conduct funerals and baptisms, continue to preach and lead worship and get involved in the life of the parish and community.

What is ordination? This is when you are 'made' a deacon or priest by the intercession of the Holy Spirit. Only a bishop can ordain and it normally takes place in a cathedral.

What is a deacon? A deacon is one of the three 'orders of ministry' in the Church of England for those in leadership. It literally means a servant and follows the example of Jesus who was a servant and washed his disciples' feet. The other types of ministers are: priest (like Revd Tim) and bishop (the current Bishop of Hertford is Rt Revd Dr Jane Mainwaring).

All are welcome to join us at 9.30am on Sunday 2^{nd} July as we welcome Ritah to St John's.

CURATE

Going to church on holiday

Norfolk: Jenny Morris and family



'Mind the Gap'

Those of you who commute into London will be familiar with the phrase 'Mind the Gap' as you board trains. Sometimes gaps can be dangerous – like at a train station platform. At other times gaps are places we ignore, normally dark and not often seeing the light of day.

As Christians we believe that everyone is loved by God as everyone is made in the image of God. Sometimes (too many times) the church has ignored or labelled as sinful parts of humanity we don't understand. It's all too easy to focus on issues our culture affirms, or on people who are 'like us'. St John's wants to be a place of radical inclusion where everyone is free to be who God has called them to be.

In an effort to more intentionally 'mind these gaps' we had a sermon series in February between Candlemass (29th Jan) and the start of Lent (22nd February). There are so many topics we could have chosen, but we looked at: The Environment, Racial Justice and Mental Health.

To find what was said, why not look at our You Tube channel.

<u>The Environment</u>. St John's Ecochurch group gives a thoughtful reflection on recycling.

<u>Racial Justice</u>. Reader Lauryn Awbrey addresses the point that the church is rarely as diverse culturally as its surrounding communities, and where fewer people of colour are in positions of leadership and authority.

<u>Mental Health</u>. For many, faith has been a great support and comfort journeying through difficult times yet we still find it hard to talk about. Revd Tim explores what he thinks God says about mental health.

Meet Ilias Poulakis Southdown Police Community Support Officer

'No day is the same, anything can happen,' says Southdown's Police Community Support Officer Ilias Poulakis. Like the time recently when he popped in to St John's Parish Hall and gave pre-schoolers a thrilling visit to his patrol car. You might recognise him from his distinctive dark beard as he's often in the area, keeping an eye out for trouble and providing a reassuring presence.

'I'd like Southdown people to know who I am and feel comfortable talking to me. By just being present and available – like the village bobbies of



the past – we aim to fight crime.' Neighbourhood problems he might deal with include anti-social behaviour, vehicle nuisance, someone acting suspicious, vandalism, shoplifting, house burglaries, non-stop alarms and cars blocking driveways or pavements.

Ilias likes face to face contact and is always happy to have a chat. 'If you have a worry, tell me, or call. Don't think you are wasting police time. If an issue is not our department, I'll signpost you to the right direction.' He's also glad to arrange visits to schools, scouts, clubs, even care homes, to talk about crime prevention.

If you don't happen to bump into Ilias, the best way to reach him is by email <u>ilias.poulakis@herts.police.uk</u> Or call the central number 101 and ask to speak to your local officer. He strongly recommends joining OWL (Online Watch Link, <u>https://www.owl.co.uk/</u>) which sends regular emails about current neighbourhood risks and crimes, and positive advice.

DID YOU KNOW?

We have just celebrated the Coronation of King Charles III. Did you know that in St John's there is something to commemorate the Coronation of Queen Elizbeth II in 1953? Next time you are visiting, if you look up at the organ loft you will notice four shields, bearing representations of St Cecilia (patron saint of musicians), St Mark, St Alban and St John the Baptist. New hangings were made for the altar in coronation cloth of gold, bearing emblems of kingship.

Creation Care at St John's

Some of the things we do at St John's to care for our amazing natural environment are easy for everyone to do at home:

• No-mow May. St John's locks up the lawnmower in May, 'doing nothing for nature' to let the wildflowers in the grass bloom. This effortlessly provides nectar for bees, butterflies and other pollinators, which all need our help. If every lawn and verge in the UK was uncut for May, this would be a huge benefit for wildlife. Too extreme? At least try raising the lawnmower cutter bar to leave

the daisies and clover flowers. See wildlife conservationists <u>Plantlife</u> online for more ideas.

- We now have **recycling bins** in church and the hall, for paper, card, cans and plastic bottles to encourage our congregation and church hall users to recycle where possible.
- We are changing to more 'eco friendly' **cleaning products** (Ecover, Bio D, Method, etc) and use white vinegar and water for cleaning glass, and a duster/ damp cloth, rather than spray polishes. This cuts down on harsh chemicals which can damage both the environment and human health.

Some recycling facts:

- recycling one drinks can saves enough energy to power a TV for up to three hours
- each tonne of recycled paper can save 17 trees
- it takes 50 times more energy to make a battery than the energy it stores - rechargeable batteries can be used time and again, saving resources and reducing pollution
- an empty cola can thrown away will look the same in 100 years; recycled it will be ready to use again in six weeks
- food waste from Harpenden is used to generate electricity – six teabags make enough electricity to boil a kettle

St John's in bloom

Have you noticed St John's flower bed? Maybe you even go out of your way to see what's happening there on the north border of the forecourt. Spring and early summer is the focus, with chartreuse and dusky pink hellebores blooming from January to Easter. Daffodils appear, and then tulips join the parade with wallflowers chiming in. Summer promises new pleasures.

Masterminding and maintaining the display, Steve Howard has been tending the garden for twelve years. 'It's a naturalistic style, not a managed bed,' he explains. With his own garden to manage at home, he looks for things that can survive without close attention, especially robust plants that spread or self-seed, like those named above. This is a model that new (or easy-going!) gardeners can follow.

An unmistakable feature of the border is not a plant at all. The tree posts drilled with holes are bee hotels for solitary bees. Unlike honeybees, they nest individually. This summer, look for bees hovering near the holes. Depending on the cycle they might be males, hoping for young females to emerge. Or females looking for a home to lay their fertilised eggs. Later you'll notice the holes are plugged with





dried matter to keep the brood safe. An annual job is to drill and put up a new post before the flight season. But Steve leaves the old posts in place: 'They add height and curiosity to the border, giving a sculptural effect.'

You can stop and smell the roses as you watch for bees. Three years ago Steve planted a half dozen climbing roses along the back of the bed to fill in long gaps looking through to notmuch-of-a-view. His vision became roses, destined to join up and to provide seasonal interest. The climbers come in goldfinch yellow, creamy white and magenta. And ten Rosa rugosa set into the bed for mid-height interest offer their simple open blooms in white and magenta. Garden pleasures continue in autumn the rose hips will be sparks of colour brightening the bed right through to December.

On a Saturday afternoon in March the church hall was a hive of activity as members worked together happily using daffodils and garden greenery to make 150 posies for Mothering Sunday. 


