I wonder what your new beginnings are as we approach September? Maybe you are in a new and exciting place? Maybe you are somewhere you would rather not have to be?



An invitation to begin (again) with prayer...

Ithough we don't know what lies ahead (do we ever though?) we are entering into a new phase in response to the pandemic which will be more about personal decisions and responsibility, rather than legal rules and guidelines.

It's hard to know what the best thing to do is. What do we focus on first? St Cuthbert, a 7th century saint from Lindisfarne in northern England, was faced with the similar situation. He was given land by the king. What did he do first? Build the chapel, sort out the farm to live off, or where to live? All very important things. Instead, he spent 40 days praying - seeking God's guidance.

UPDATE FROM THE ECO CHURCH TEAM:

Litter pick. We had a very successful litter pick on Environment Sunday (June 6th), as our contribution to the St Albans Sustainability Festival. We collected a wide range of rubbish in the Cravells Road/Walkers Road area. We hope this will become an annual event.



Encouraging wildlife in the church grounds: You may have noticed that much of the grass around the church was not cut during May. This allowed wildflowers to bloom, providing food



for bees and other pollinators. The grass slope between the vicarage and church will remain unmown until late summer, to encourage different wildflowers. Steve, who looks after the wonderful North flowerbed, already includes many plants for bees and butterflies, and has recently added some 'bee hotels' to provide nest sites for solitary bees. Do take a look when you are next passing.

We are now collecting used medicine blister packs (the foil containers for tablets) for recycling by the recycling company TerraCycle. The collection is being organised by Harpenden Girlguiding to raise money for local charities, and our box will be one collection point for that scheme. There is a labelled box in the church porch, which will be regularly emptied, which is accessible whenever the church is open. Please ensure that all packs are *empty* (no tablets) and please don't include any cardboard/plastic wrapping or paper inserts - these should go in your home recycling where appropriate. This is an easy way to recycle these blister packs, which would otherwise have to go to landfill. Thank you for your help.



FOOD, GLORIOUS FOOD!



n Waitrose's "Weekend" paper for the 5th July, there was an article looking at some research conducted by WRAP (Waste & Resources Action Programme) into how many blackcurrants were falling on to the ground and not being collected by the harvesting machine. The four farmers doing this were surprised to discover it was as much as 39% of their crop. But what caught my attention in this article was the fact that roughly one third of food produced around the world is wasted, accounting for about 8% of total manmade greenhouse emissions.

That sounds awful – one third of world produced food wasted - producing 8% of total manmade greenhouse emissions.

However, have you ever considered how much greenhouse gas the food we throw away creates – good food bought but never eaten because we bought too much. Reading this article led me to a Hertfordshire County Council website where I discovered that if more food waste was recycled rather than put in

the bin for general waste £2.5 million could be saved (helping to keep our Council tax down), that collected food waste is recycled into energy for our homes and compost for farmland, and that food waste that ends up in landfill with our regular rubbish creates methane, a harmful greenhouse gas 25 times stronger than CO2.

In the UK we throw away more than 7 million tonnes of food and drink every year – enough to fill Wembley Stadium. So, if you want to save on your food bill and cut down on food waste and greenhouse gas for which you're responsible, these four steps could help:

- 1. Plan ahead plan your menus and shopping. Don't buy more than you need even though the supermarket offers seem appealing.
- 2. Store correctly.
- 3. Cook only what you need.
- 4. Recycle what you can't eat.

The first step is the most important –

stick to your shopping list. Did you know you can get a discount on home composters? Once you've got some really good compost, your flower and vegetable beds will benefit not only from the compost but also the worms that will come with it.

There's a website "Love Food, Hate Waste" for tips on food planning, storage, recipes and money.

Talking about recipes, one of the things I find difficult sometimes is reducing a recipe for 4 or 6 people to

just one. I don't always want several portions in the freezer, and anyway some don't necessarily freeze well. Then I discovered Delia Smith's "One is Fun", and I have had fun working my way through her book – I can highly recommend it!

PS By the time you read this I hope some of you will have discovered the recycling bins at the Co-op in Southdown, where we can take bread bags, crisp packets, pasta bags, fruit and vegetable wrappers, and pizza wrappers as well.

CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 10-16 MAY 2021



For the first time, we tried Delivery-only envelopes (instead of the usual House-to-House collection) which enabled us to cover many more roads, including the majority in the parish. We hope that most people were inspired to give online, but as an alternative, we arranged a few drop-off points across the town which yielded £5348 plus £919 in Gift Aid, totalling £6267 - a very good result!

At this stage, the national total for CAW from digital income stands at over £2 million, but this is still very provisional as cash income takes longer to arrive.

This generous response will make a substantial difference to those poor rural communities in Kenya losing their access to a reliable water supply, because of climate change. During the pandemic, we have experienced the loss of aspects of our lives that we had previously taken for granted, but, at least, we have drinkable water literally on tap. CAW highlighted the plight of 67yr old Rose who had to walk for hours each day to collect water for her grandchildren. Thanks to CA support, her community can build an earth dam so when the rains do come, they will have the water they need to live, regardless of any extreme weather events.

Despite this positive story, the need remains huge and so Christian Aid has launched a Global Hunger Appeal for 30 million people in 20 countries teetering on the brink of famine, including South Sudan, Ethiopia and Afghanistan. 
