

You'll always be welcome to join us. Whether you do or not, may I encourage



Churchwardens' report

belated happy new year to all. Just as plants show signs of awakening from their winter's sleep and the days are lengthening, we too are looking forward to spring with more hope than in the last few years.

As we started a new church year, Advent and Christmas reminded us of the core of our faith – the first coming of Jesus Christ into the world and the light that dawned in dark times and cannot be extinguished. A lovely Christmas tree, decorations by our Junior Church, and the amazing floral displays of our flower guild combined to make the sacred space look festive. The artwork on the hedge, which began as poppies for Remembrance Day, morphed from 'hope' to 'joy' and was lit up nightly by the Christmas star.

This year our new vicar and the ministry team had planned a variety of services and events, with something for everyone, regardless of age and whether they were visitors or our regular congregation. We had to cancel a couple of events owing to the new COVID-19 variant and our wish to keep everyone as safe as possible. Particularly disappointing was the decision we took to cancel the annual Beer and Carols, but we will be back in 2022! Despite some last-minute rearranging, the majority of services and celebrations went ahead and were well attended.

We ran a Christmas holiday club in late December and our Junior Church performed a fabulous Nativity play on the Sunday before Christmas. Madeleine Venner and Anna Chambers were literally herding sheep and the performance filled the church with clear narration, songs, and instruments.

Our choir, directed by Roger Carter, also provided beautiful accompaniment to the bible passages telling the Christmas story for our service of nine lessons and carols, and we enjoyed mulled wine and mince pies in the hall afterwards.

On Christmas Eve we joined our friends at Southdown Methodist Church for our annual "Walking to Bethlehem" carols and prayers. We are hugely grateful to Tony at The Carpenter's Arms for providing an inn stop, with refreshments, on the way up to the common.

Moving into Epiphany, we were delighted to welcome Helen Charlston and Amici Voices for a sung Eucharist and Byrd's four-part mass setting.

Our church looks different inside as we have made some temporary rearrangement of the furniture, including the altar, so the choir and music can be included more fully and safely into services. We continue to live stream the 9.30am Sunday Eucharist on YouTube to reach as many people as possible. A group of people deliver "church at home" materials weekly to those who prefer this.

Many people work quietly – and largely unseen – in a huge variety of roles that enable the church to be open and our hall to be used by the community. Cleaners go about their duties diligently; Matt Barter and the premises committee are active in

Lent 2022 at St John's Harpenden

The season of Lent is a time to deepen our relationship with God through prayer, reflection and study as we prepare for Holy Week and our annual remembering of the suffering, crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ. An offer of spiritual support

Many of us are conscious of our physical health. After a health checkup at the GP or a fitness test at the gym we usually come away reassured and with some sensible advice about what we can do to improve our health and fitness. Alongside a programme of discussion and worship during this season of Lent, we want to extend a special opportunity for every adult at St John's to have a 45-minute conversation with a member of the ministry team. A spiritual checkup, if you will. We really recommend this to you. As people of faith, our spiritual health and wellbeing is something we should also take seriously, but often we don't have a chance to think about our faith and prayer life or talk it through with someone.

We'd like to offer you the chance to do just that, with a relaxed and confidential one-on-one conversation for every adult who wants it. This is an opportunity for you to talk about whatever aspect of faith you'd like to discuss, in total

confidence. It's a wonderful way to be encouraged, listened to, and supported in your relationship with God, and without any judgement or sense of being tested in some way.

Forming new (good) habits

Taking steps towards becoming a more eco-conscious community

s I sit down to write this article on 31 December 2021, I can't help thinking about the year that's ended; full of hope for the year to come.

The year 2021 was lots of things to different people, with a lack of holidays, missing family and perhaps feeling like the year was slipping past us, which can make it hard to remember anything good! But for some of us, having a bit more time on our hands was just what we need to make a positive change. When life is going at break-neck speed we tend to cut corners, thinking we have to do the quickest and the easiest. Maybe your life was just as busy, if not more hectic in 2021? Even if that were so, it might still be the ideal time to make positive changes that will have a beneficial impact in the long run.

As I look back at 2021, I realise it was the year I did something about plastic in our house. I made a decision in January that we would throw as little into our brown landfill rubbish bin as possible. This made me consider what each potential piece of rubbish was. Most of it was flexible plastic. I can hardly believe that a year ago there was nowhere for this rubbish to go but into landfill.

I took the bold move of sorting it according to its manufacturer and posting it back to them! I also Googled to see if there were any suitable recycling programmes and was introduced to the world of TerraCycle (www.terracycle.com). It informed me I could recycle some of the flexible plastics, so I set about keeping those to one side. I also set up

a recycling collection for certain items at St John's. But then, in the summer, we heard that a few supermarkets were providing flexible plastic recycling points. I'd like to think that my deliveries to them earlier in the year helped to push towards this. If they did, that was a real positive!

Twenty years ago, as a household, we chucked everything in a round dustbin! The council refuse collectors walked around the back of our house and removed the bags from the bin, we didn't even need to put the bin out! My point is, things change and we have to learn new habits. This year I have learned to put all my household's flexible plastic into a new (well upcycled from our Cravell's Road repurpose event) bin. I don't have to think about it; it's become habit.

Recycling is a great and important thing, but to use less plastic is even better! My second big positive from 2021 was exploring the world of refilling at the Refill Pantry in St Albans (www. therefillpantry.co.uk). Again, it's about changing habits. First you might want to start gathering useful vessels once they're empty. For example, toilet cleaner is best when it's in one of those angled-neck bottles, and cleaners are best in spray bottles.

I especially like the Iron and Velvet

cleaning products that come in dissolvable sachets, available from the Refill Pantry, because you don't even need a container as the packaging dissolves in water. You can also buy containers at the Refill Pantry, but really that does defeat the whole purpose, so it's best avoided! There are also lots of plastic-free alternatives for some items, particularly toiletries. Such as deodorant in cardboard tubes and toothpaste in tablet form or powder in glass jars. Even some of the mainstream brands are bringing out solid bar versions of shampoos and conditioners, but for environmental consciousness it may still be better to go for a brand that has always had that ethos in mind.

I estimate I avoided bringing more than 100 plastic bottles into our house in 2021. If each of the 2,000 households in St John's parish did the same, that could mean a reduction of around 200,000 plastic bottles a year! And if all the households in the UK saved just one bottle from being needed, that would be 27 million bottles! Every little thing we

do CAN make a difference.

So, if you're still looking for some new-year resolutions (or the ones you made have already fallen by the wayside) how about a couple of these:

Make 2022 the year you:

- ✓ recycled all your flexible plastic (take it to Co-op right here in Southdown; it couldn't be easier)
- ✓ change some of your toiletries to plastic-free
- ✓ use the recycling point in the St John's porch (we accept pill blister packs, 'good' refill packets, candles, birthday cards and used stamps)
- ✓ organise your recyclable waste using special bins, bags or dedicate a cupboard to it, so it's easier to sort and store
- ✓ Find and begin to use your local refill shops


